### SECTION 4 - EMERGENCY & FIRST-AID PROCEDURES

**EYE:** Immediately flush eyes with water; remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue flushing eyes for at least 15 minutes, occasionally lifting the upper and lower lids. Get medical aid immediately, preferably from an ophthalmologist.

**SKIN:** Remove contaminated clothing. Wash exposed area with soap and water. If symptoms persist, seek medical attention.

**INGESTION:** Seek medical attention. If individual is drowsy or unconscious, do not give anything by mouth. Drink milk or egg whites as indicated by a physician, medical facility, or poison control center. Do NOT induce vomiting.

**SECTION 6 – ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES**

**PERSONAL PRECAUTIONS, PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT AND EMERGENCY PROCEDURES:**

Use personal protective equipment outlined in section 8 for normal handling of this material. In the event of a spill, large amounts of water can be used to dilute the acid to safe levels. Ideally, sodium bicarbonate (*i.e.*, baking soda) should be used to neutralize the acid.

**ENVIRONMENTAL PRECAUTIONS:** Prevent release of unused product to the environment if possible. Only spent and neutralized product should be allowed to enter drains or sewer lines.

Remove contaminated clothing and clean before re-use. Wash hands before eating or drinking. Avoid inhalation of vapors or mist. Please wear appropriate personal protective equipment for handling of this product as outlined in Section 8.

**STORAGE:** Store in a cool, dry location. Keep container tightly closed. Maintain adequate ventilation.
